
Dear Mr. Miller

This is in response to your September 22, 1997 letter to the Secretary of the Air Force regarding Armstrong Laboratory and Brooks Air Force Base (AFB), Texas. She has asked SAF/AQRT to review and address your concerns, as appropriate.

Armstrong Laboratory has performed with distinction in the development and demonstration of technologies to enhance the training, effectiveness and sustainment of Air Force personnel. The Air Force's aircrews and groundcrews are the best in the world. The Air Force will continue to train and equip its members, and will continue to develop technologies to improve its effectiveness.

With respect to budget planning, the Air Force is committed to maintaining a strong Science and Technology (S&T) program. At the same time, the Air Force must balance S&T funding with the downsizing of the defense budget, and must maintain the right mix of aerospace technology programs in the total S&T portfolio. Currently, the Air Force is in the process of readjusting its modernization investments in connection with a review of projected budgets and expenditures. No final decisions have been made.

I appreciate your interest in Armstrong Laboratory and Brooks AFB, and hope this information is helpful to you.
